FOREWORD

AFTER A LAPSE of three years, during which the nation was engaged in a great war, which called for the concentration of every aim and effort for its successful conclusion, the publication of the "Crescent Beach Echoes" is resumed.

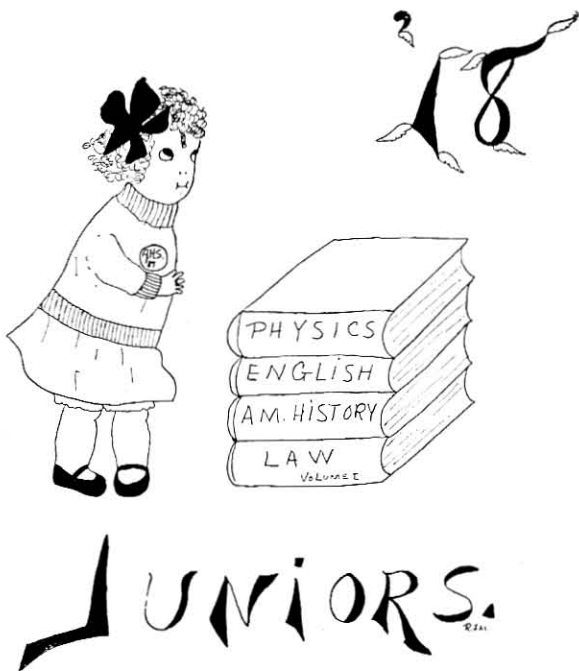
