




An issue of "School Daze" was entered in the 1955 School Press Project, a contest sponsored by the Anti-Tuberculosis Association.


#### DEBATE


#### JUNIOR WOLVES RATE HIGH

#### OCONTO FALLS NUDGES ALGOMA




