1956 Gridiron Season

The Algoma football team got off to a good start under its new coach, Ralph McKenna, by trouncing Seymour 32—6 in a non-conference meeting. It was a one-sided battle all the way, with Baudhuin and Hutter each scoring once and Junio three times. Meverden converted twice.

The Wolves started their conference season with a hard-fought game at Oconto Falls. Mauer, Junio, and Baudhuin each scored for the victors, with two conversions by Meverden, making the final score 20—7.

Pulaski, with its powerful running attack, proved too much for the Wolves, beating them 20—7. Algoma's only score came on Baudhuin's 80-yard run, with Meverden kicking the point after the touchdown.

The East De Pere Redbirds came to Algoma with high spirits, but the Wolves' balanced attack proved too much for them. Baudhuin, Hutter, Mauer, and Junio each scored six points, while Meverden added two extra points, making the final score 27—0.

Preble's Hornets were victorious over the Wolves by the score of 19—12 at Preble Park. Even though the Wolves played a good game, they were unable to overcome the powerful Hornet attacks. Algoma scored on a pass from Baudhuin to Mueller and again on a short plunge by Junio.

The defeat of the West De Pere Phantoms, 19—14, made the homecoming a huge success. A great goal line stand by the Wolves in the last minute and one-half of play high-lighted the game. Algoma scored on a dazzling 55-yard run by Mauer, a pass from Junio to Laurent, and again on a short plunge by Baudhuin. This was the first victory for the Wolves over the Phantoms since they joined our conference.

The Algoma Wolves spoiled the Sturgeon Bay Clippers' homecoming by an impressive 37—0 win. The Wolves dominated play throughout the game with their hard running and fine passing attacks. The Wolves scored on passes from Baudhuin to Mueller and Hutter, a short plunge by Hafeman, and three runs by Junio, one being a 66-yard gallop. One extra point was scored; that on a pass from Baudhuin to Laurent.

The Wolves downed the last-placed Kewaunee Indians 34—0 to end a very successful season. The first half proved fairly tough for the Wolves, but they scored twice on short passes from Baudhuin to Junio. In the 3rd quarter Mauer broke loose on a 70-yard punt return which seemed to break the Indians' backs. Shortly after, a pass from Baudhuin to Hutter and another from Hafeman to Kashik both connected for touchdowns. Hutter proved accurate on extra point kicking, succeeding in 4 out of 5 attempts, to make the final score 34—0.

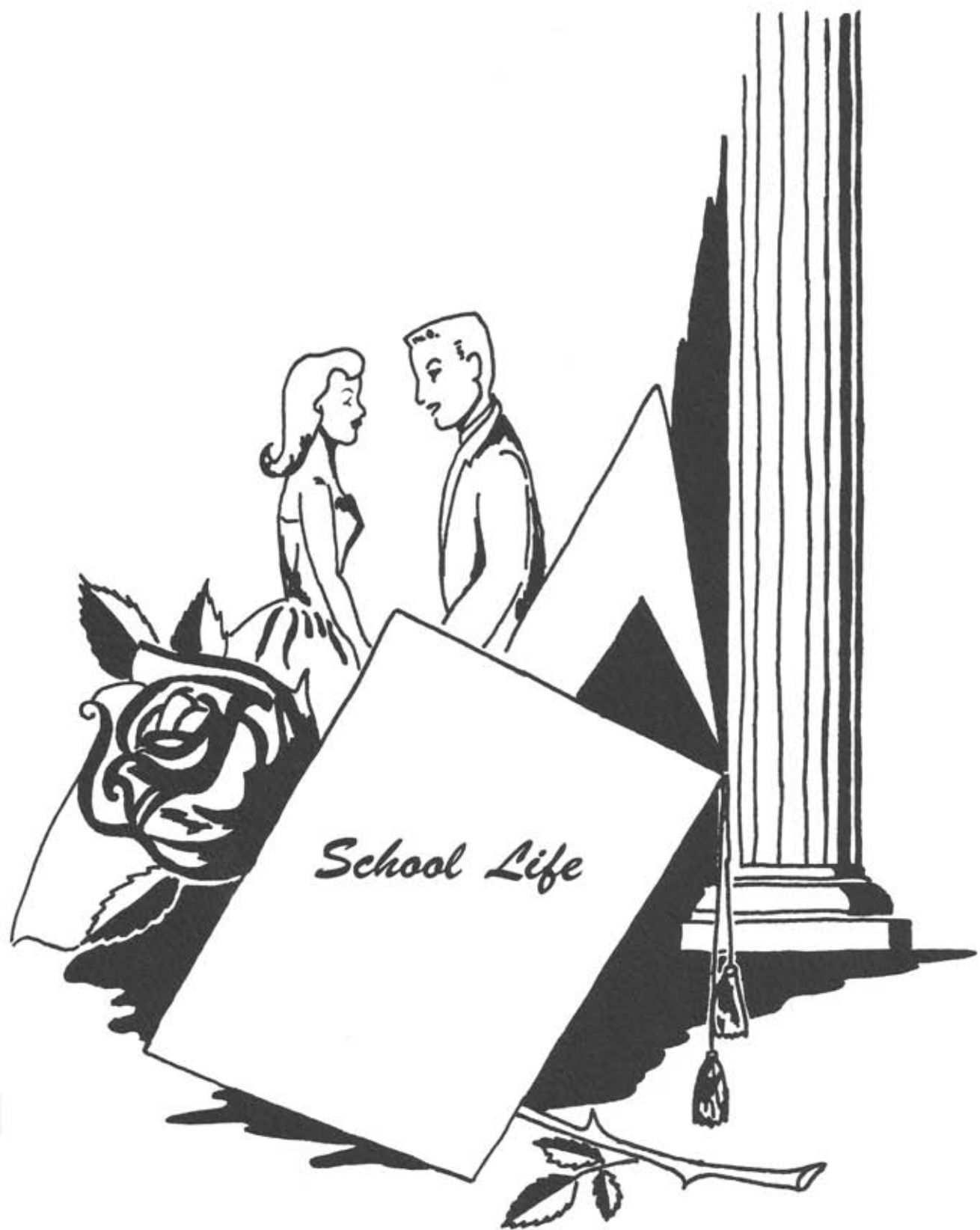

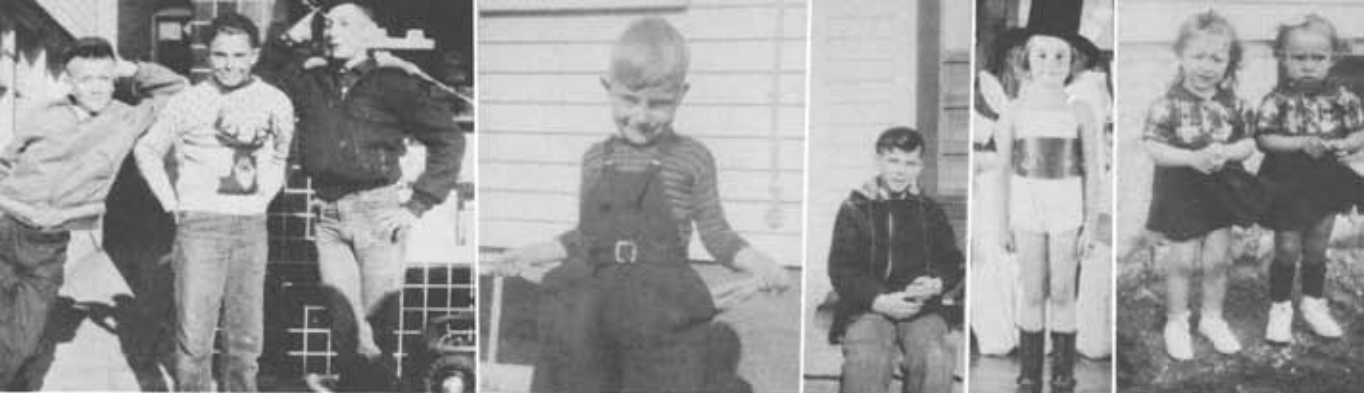
