Gridiron Highlights

Although Algoma had a lighter, less experienced team, the Wolves managed to win the season non-conference opener with a decisive score of 19-0. The game was highlighted by Entringer's pass interception and 72 yard touchdown run.

In the first 1957 Northeastern Wisconsin Conference game played at Algoma, our Wolves were defeated by the Panthers 14-6. In this game the Wolves lost the service of one of their regular tackles, Lloyd Wolter. The Panthers scored early in the first and second quarters and the Wolves never caught up.

At Pulaski the Algoma Wolves picked up their first conference win, scoring once in each quarter. Pulaski's only score came on a seventy yard pass. Hafeman had a terrific night, completing 13 out of 19 passes.

In a hard fought battle at Minahan Stadium, the Wolves brightened their record with a 13-0 victory over the powerful East De Pere team. Algoma scored early in the first quarter and once again in the second quarter in a close game.

Algoma's homecoming spirits were dampened when a powerful squad of Preble Hornets defeated the Wolves by the sad score of 33-0. Fumbling and pass interceptions had much to do with the Wolves' downfall as the team went scoreless. Several times the Wolves threatened only to lose the ball.

The Sturgeon Bay Clippers ended Algoma's five year win streak by nipping the Wolves 21-14. The Wolves took the lead early on a 39 yard pass from Hafeman to Kramer with Bultman kicking the extra point. Willems scored the second touchdown on a 15 yard run around end, Bultman again converted.

Although the Algoma Wolves played one of the finest defensive battles of the season, their offense remained unable to get going. When the final whistle had blown the Algoma Wolves and West De Pere Phantoms had ended in a scoreless tie 0-0.

The Algoma Wolves scalped the Kewaunee Indians by a score of 19-0 ending the season. Kewaunee's homecoming spirits were high but Algoma's passing attack again proved too much. The Wolves took the lead early in the game with Hafeman passing two to Laurent. In the second quarter Hafeman threw to Laurent for two more touchdowns. Bultman succeeded in kicking one extra point.


The team played to the best of their ability and the student body provided enthusiastic support when the chips were down and the going got rough.




