

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Parents are important! This fact is becoming stressed more and more as it is emphasized in magazines, newspapers, and by statements emanating from the mouths of youth. It is further shown in the dedication of the 1960 Scroll of the Wolves.

Parents and teachers and leaders of youth working together need rightfully be thoughtful and deeply concerned about their responsibility in developing or helping to develop self-disciplined children. Ideas about the goals of discipline and the methods of attaining them have changed drastically in just a few generations. One of the causes of this change is that democratic ideals have become clearer and are being accepted by a larger number of people. These democratic ideals require each person to show initiative, to live with a reasonable degree of freedom, and to accept responsibility willingly.

This change, however, does not warrant, nor does it imply that authority is not needed or not wanted by youth. Freedom must come gradually as youth learns to adjust to it and as he is capable of developing the necessary self-discipline to conform with the behavior which is acceptable to his peers and to the society in which he lives.

Youth are daily proving to us adults that the majority of them can set up an acceptable standard of ideals, they do have and show initiative, they can accept a reasonable amount of freedom and can willingly accept and assume responsibility. We, as adults, must promote and encourage the furtherance of this development by being firm with youth in his periods of uncertainty, when he needs firmness to curb his behavior on occasion, in order to offer protection to him or to protect the rights of others.

If discipline is conceived and executed in a spirit of fairness, it might truly become what it was originally intended to be; a way of helping youth to live well and wisely, with a steady assumption of independent responsibility as their growing powers permit.





Teams were organized to play such sports as soccer, basketball, and volleyball. The annual basketball and volleyball tournaments also took place.


The F. H. A.-G. A. A. basketball tournament, started last year, was again played. A new activity added was the group ice-skating party at the Brown County Arena.
