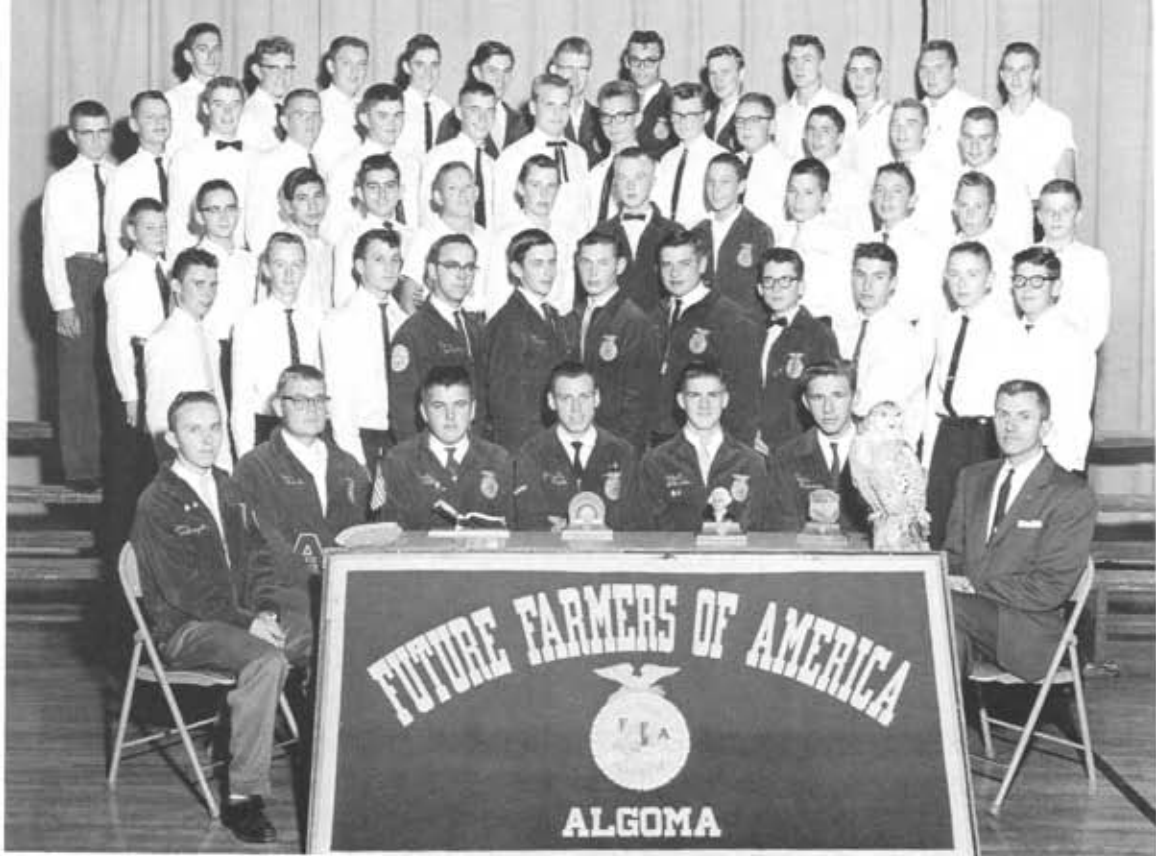

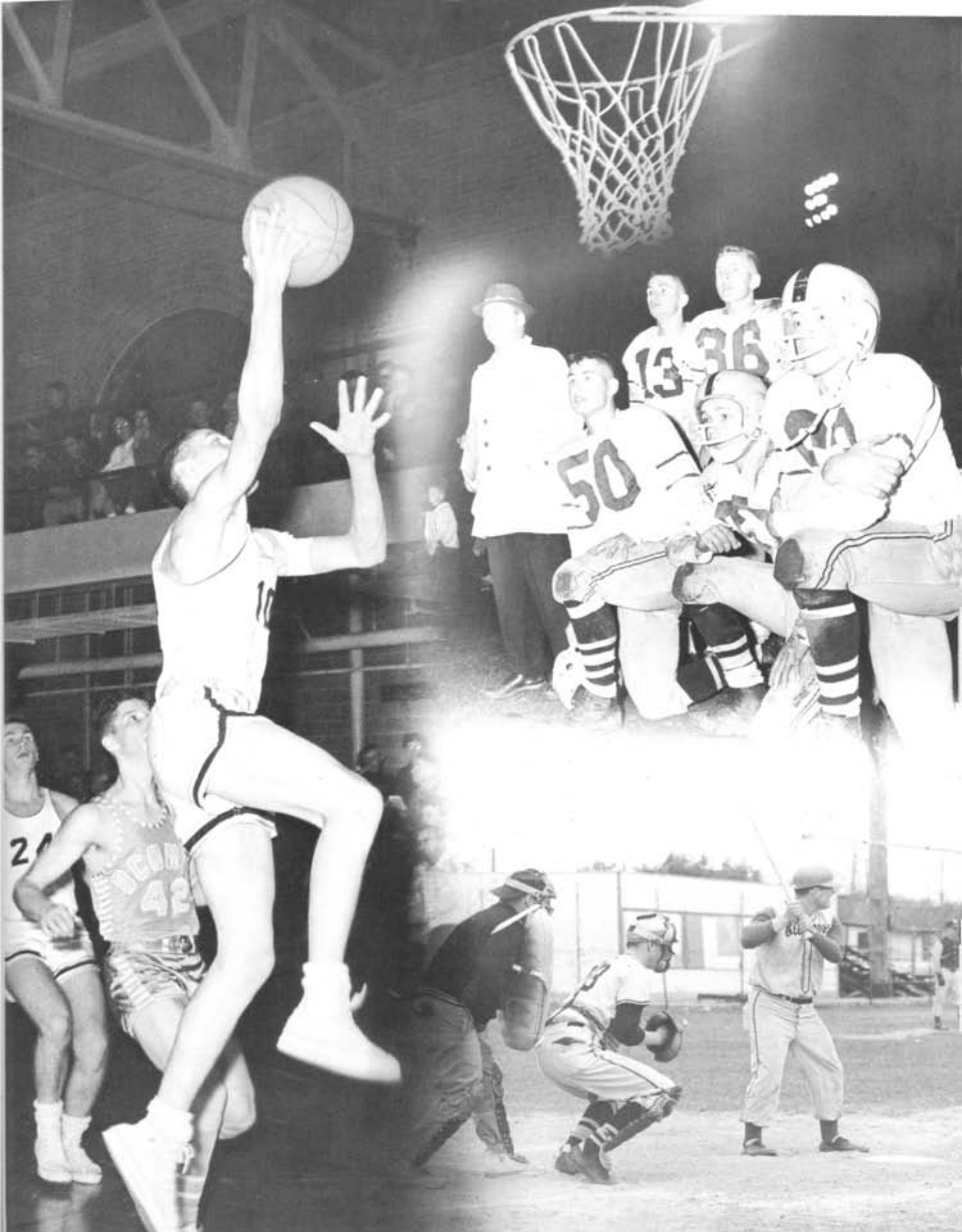
The cast, including twelve girls and six boys did an able job in portraying the characters in this play by Dana Thomas.

Algoma's Sibilsky remembered for basketball success

When longtime Algoma residents learned of Mike Sibilsky's death at age 65 in September, their thoughts may have turned back to March 1, 1962. On that memorable night, Sibilsky was the toast of Algoma.

As morning approached on that day 47 years ago, a late-winter arctic blast had sent the mercury plunging to a bone-chilling 29 degrees below zero. But the weather wasn't the big story that day.

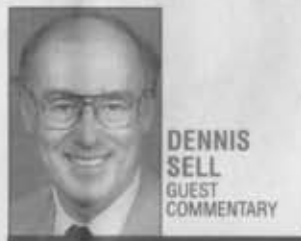
The Algoma and Kewaunee basketball teams were to square off that evening in the opening game of the state tournament. Ranked ninth in the state's "Big 16," Kewaunee was favored to advance to the tournament finals in Madison, at the time a single class affair. The Indians had compiled a perfect 17-0 record (14-0 in the conference) and had defeated their opponents by an average of 19 points. Meanwhile, Algoma had fashioned an overall 13-5 mark (10-4 in the conference), including a pair of losses to Kewaunee.

The weather wasn't the only cold element. Algoma players Bruce Charles and Tom Baudhuin were both sick; Charles with a cold and Baudhuin with the flu.

"As pharmacist Ed Neseemann was filling my prescription," Baudhuin recalled, "he said that he had made a wager with his brother, a Kewaunee physician, and that we had better win. Everyone was talking about this game."

Some 1,700 fans in Luxemburg's new gym were about to witness one of the most memorable games in the long and colorful Algoma-Kewaunee rivalry. The contest was close throughout. The atmosphere became so intense that an Algoma cheerleader fainted. Later, an egg was thrown from the stands, striking Algoma Coach Leroy Sroda and splattering on the floor.

Midway through the final period, Tim Zettel, Algoma's leading scorer,

fouled out. Sroda called upon Sibilsky, a senior who had seen limited playing time during the season, to replace Zettel.

Sibilsky was the son of Marv Sibilsky, a longtime Algoma grade school teacher and athletic coach. For years, Marv ran a Saturday basketball program for grade-school boys that stressed fundamentals. Sibilsky's program was a key component of Algoma's basketball success from the late 1940s through the late 1960s.

In contrast to his business-like father, Mike had a reputation as a jokester who craved attention. One night, he spread ketchup on his face and clothes and attempted to scare patrons of the local A&W drive-in. On another occasion, Sibilsky rented a boat to go fishing after asking radio station WDOR to play "Michael Row the Boat Ashore," a popular song of the day, at a specific time that day. Upon hearing the song, Mike began rowing the

boat to shore, much to the amusement of his friends.

In the lexicon of the times, the younger Sibilsky was "rare," the equivalent of being "cool" in the 1950s or "awesome" today. Local legend Jack Urban gave him the nickname "Pace" when Sibilsky was assigned the same football jersey number as Jim Pace, star running back from the University of Michigan who earned All-American honors in 1957.

If Sibilsky was nervous about entering the showdown game in front of the large crowd, he certainly didn't show it. "Pace came onto the court with a big grin on his face," recalled Mark Wautlet, an Algoma starter. "I told him that this was serious business."

Sibilsky promptly sank



a jump shot from the corner and later scored two more baskets. The game was tied at the end of regulation and again at the ends of both the first and second overtime periods. In the final seconds of the third overtime, Charles, who played despite his cold, sank a basket to give Algoma a 71-69 upset win. As the final buzzer sounded, Algoma fans poured

onto the court to mob the players who, in turn, carried their coach off the floor.

Algoma's upset win made news around the state. The next day's Milwaukee Journal sports section had the Wolves' victory as part of a five-column banner headline.

With his six points, Sibilsky had nearly reached his season total of

seven. Over the years, Sibilsky's total output has been embellished to the point where some think he scored 20 or 25 points against Kewaunee. Rest assured, however, that without Sibilsky's contributions, it's doubtful whether Algoma would have prevailed.

In his later years, Sibilsky, who lived in Kaukauna, became somewhat of a

recluse. With his reputation, one could have imagined him paying a dozen youngsters a dollar each to ask for his autograph when he returned to Algoma for reunions. The reality is that Sibilsky rarely, if ever, attended reunions of his graduating class or any other alumni event.

For one memorable evening more than 47 years ago, Sibilsky was the toast of the town.
