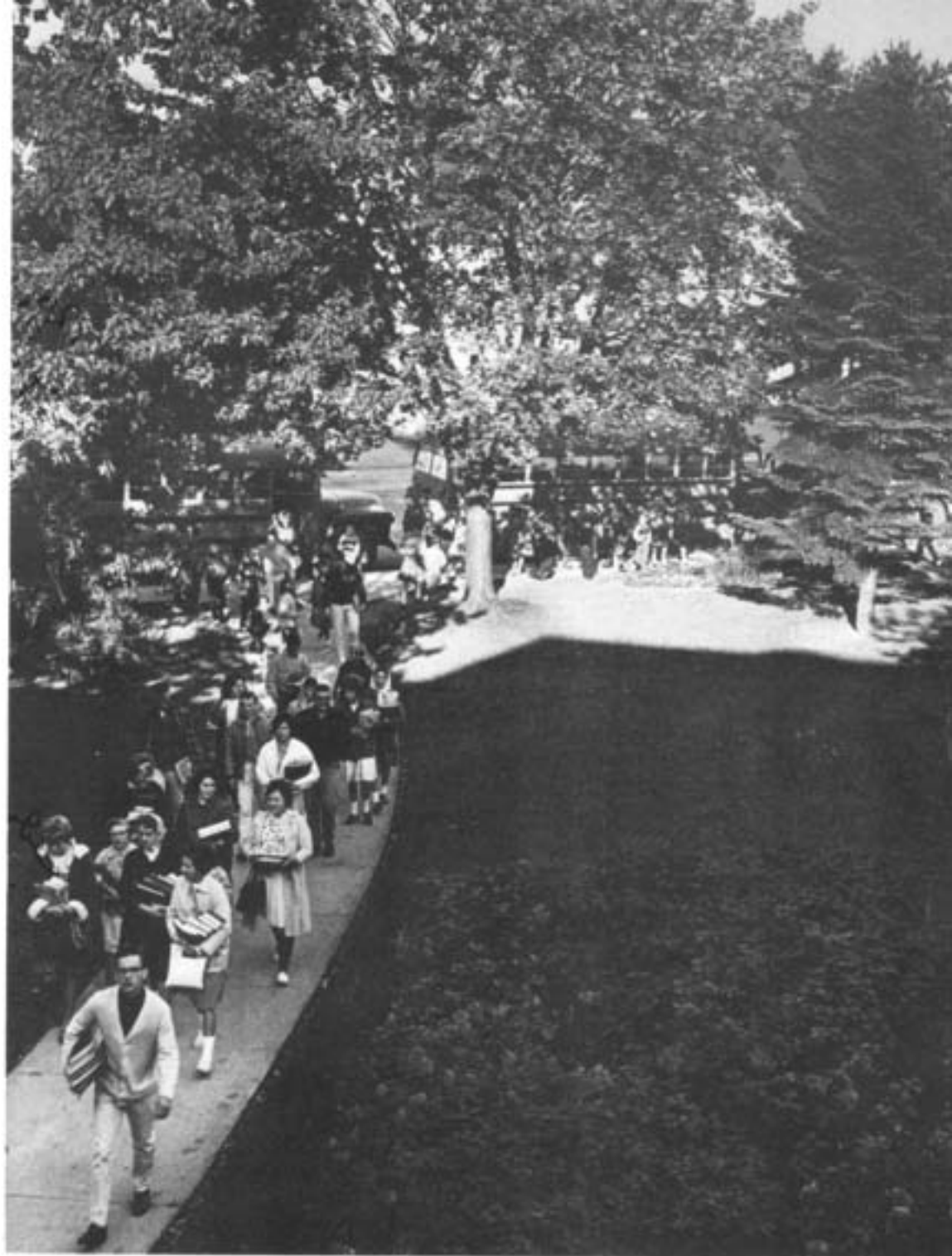

## Time Marches On

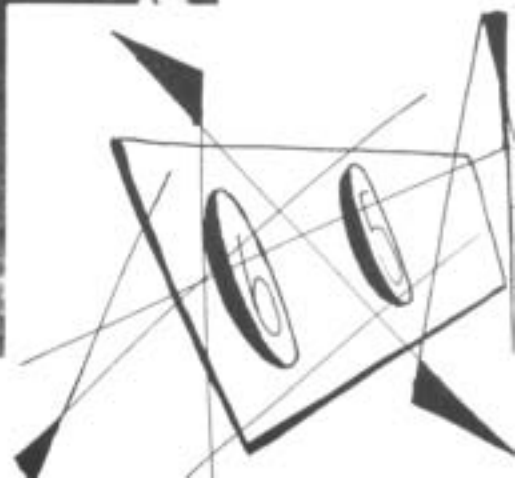

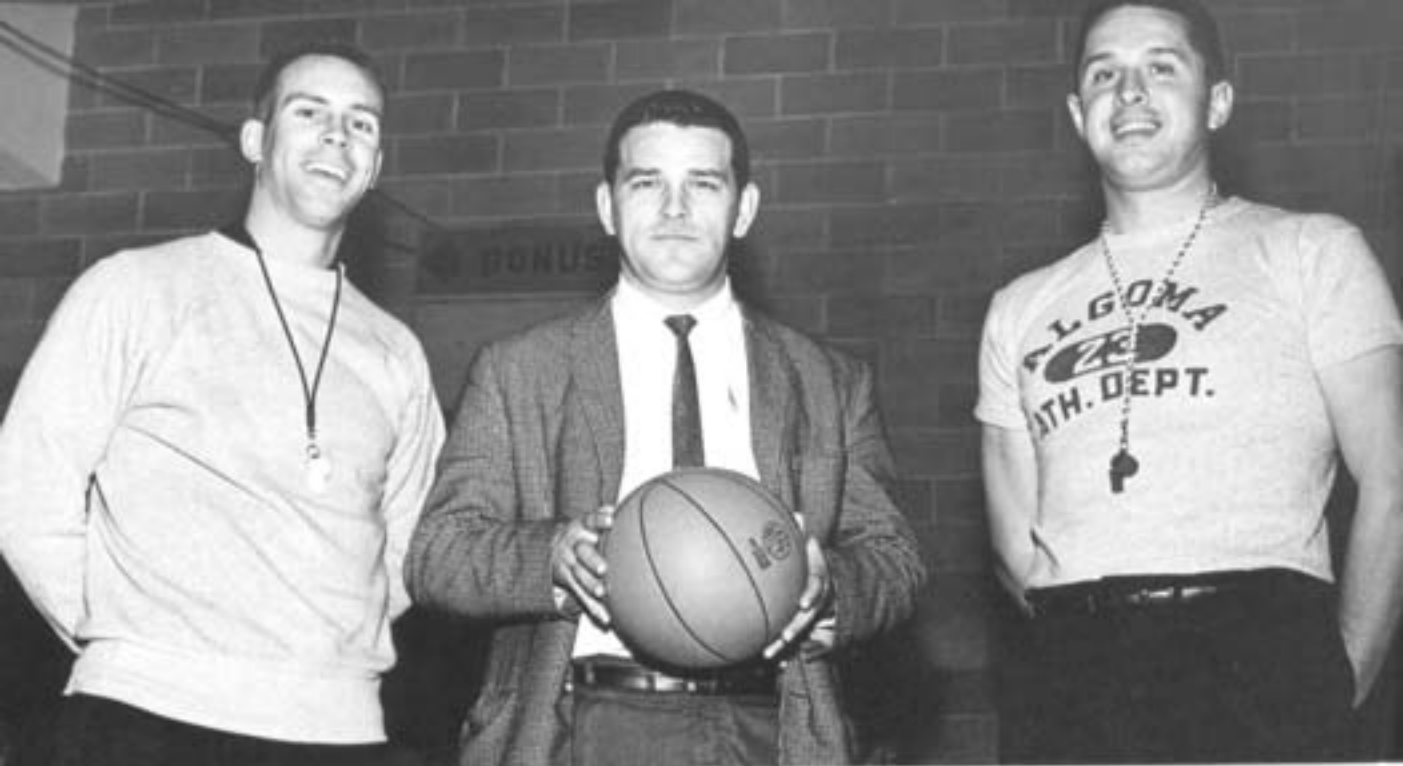
