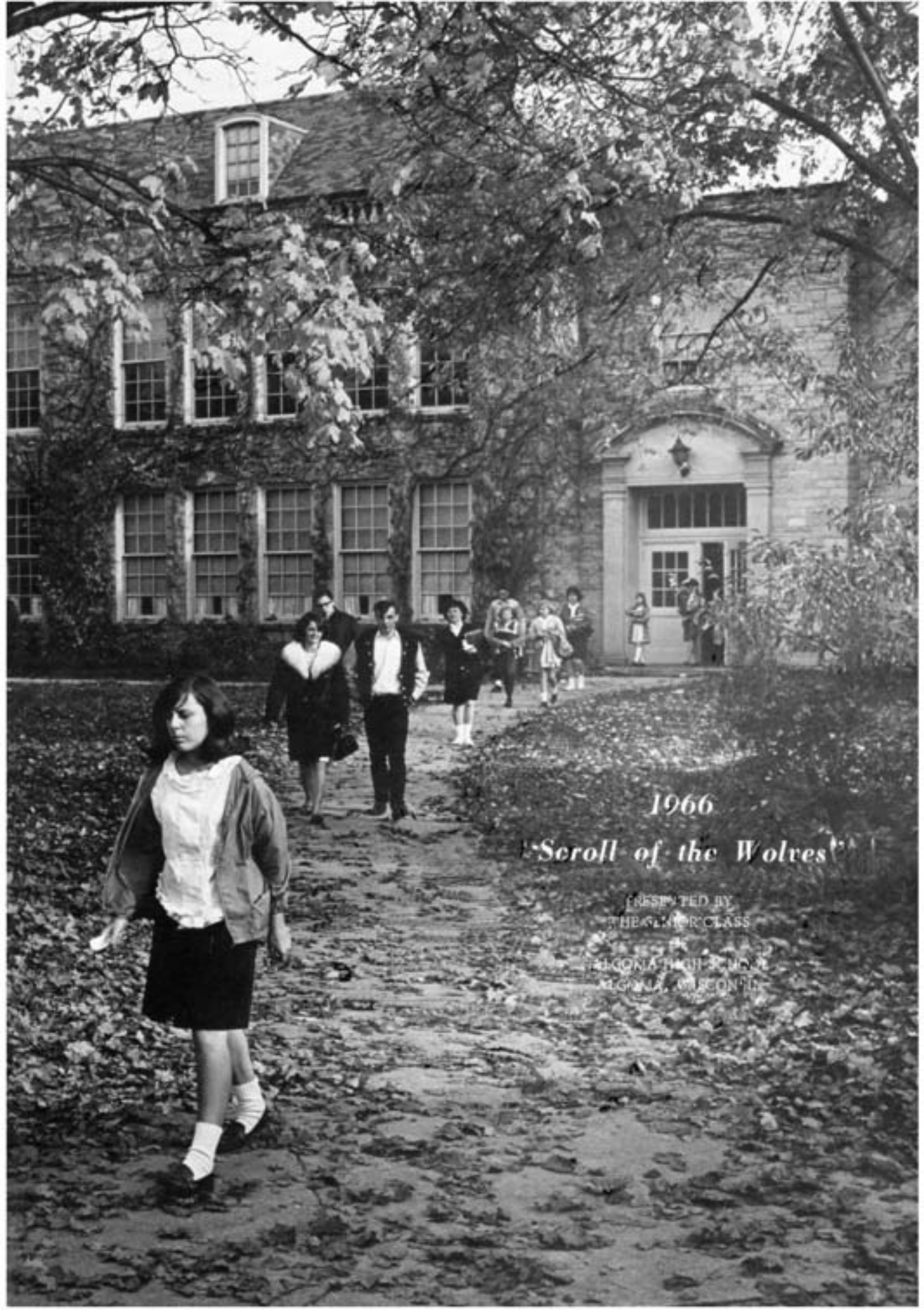

PROFILE OF A STUDENT OF A.H.S.

He came to us as a freshman in the fall of 1951. He had ideas, as many freshman have, of how he was going to make the most of high school and really profit by every opportunity which came to him.

When he made out his schedule for his first year, he projected it for all four years and planned to have a minimum of twenty credits including all of the mathematics and science the school offered, two years of industrial arts, typing and band besides the required subjects. Football and basketball were also listed. Plans were to participate in debate, forensics or drama.

Tests taken before making out his schedule revealed that he was well above average and should plan to take a college preparatory course.

Things went well the first year. His grades were good. He was on the varsity team in both football and basketball. He also made the team in baseball. He was on the honor roll both semesters.

The second year was also a good year and the accomplishments equalled or were even better than during his freshman year. He continued on the varsity football and basketball team. He was an honor student.

The third and fourth years were great years at A.H.S. Good scholastic work was maintained, and he excelled in sports. When the Senior Class Play was cast he earned a leading role. He was chosen

M.V.P. in both basketball and football, and he helped pitch his school baseball team to a conference championship.

On graduation night he received The Legion Scholarship and Legion Athletic Awards, a Scholarship Key, the Valedictorian's pin and a four year scholarship to a university.

This graduate has completed college, earned a Doctor's Degree in Medicine and is currently a Captain in the U.S. Army serving as an M.D. at an Air Force Base.

Many other students like him who have graduated from A.H.S. have had successful careers and are leaders in their respective communities. We have a good school. Our school is growing even better. Courses offered are in line with changing times and with advances in science. Our standards are high. We commend those students who have done well.

We believe our school offers a program that affords enough flexibility for all students to complete high school. He who attends our school and has the desire to succeed will succeed. 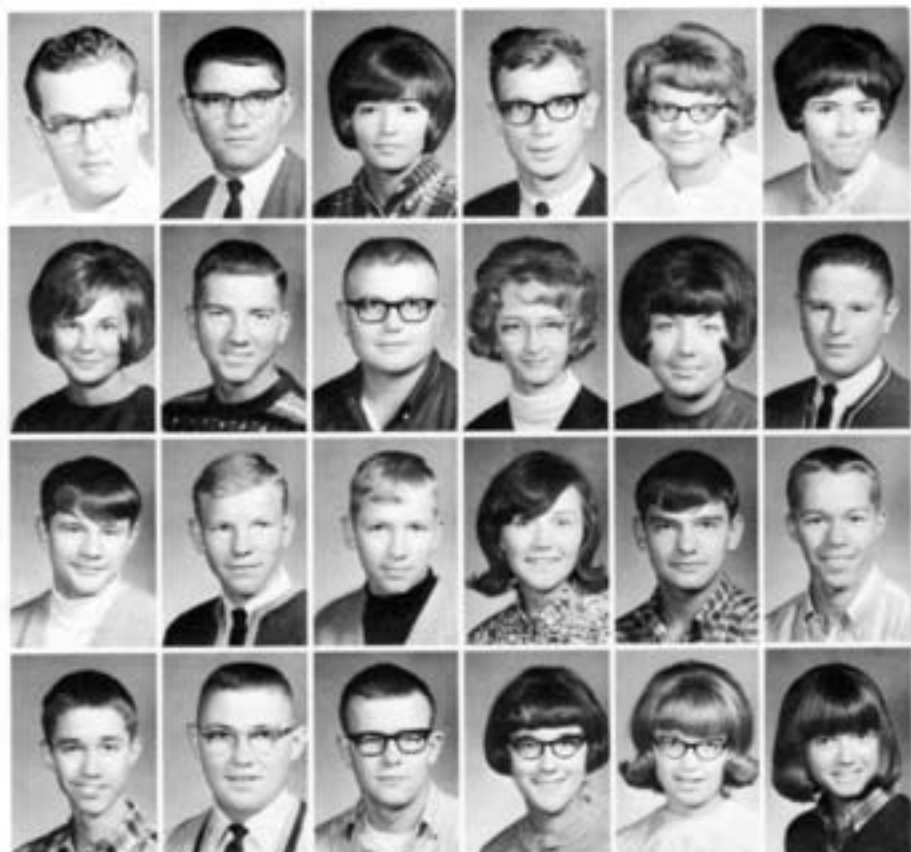

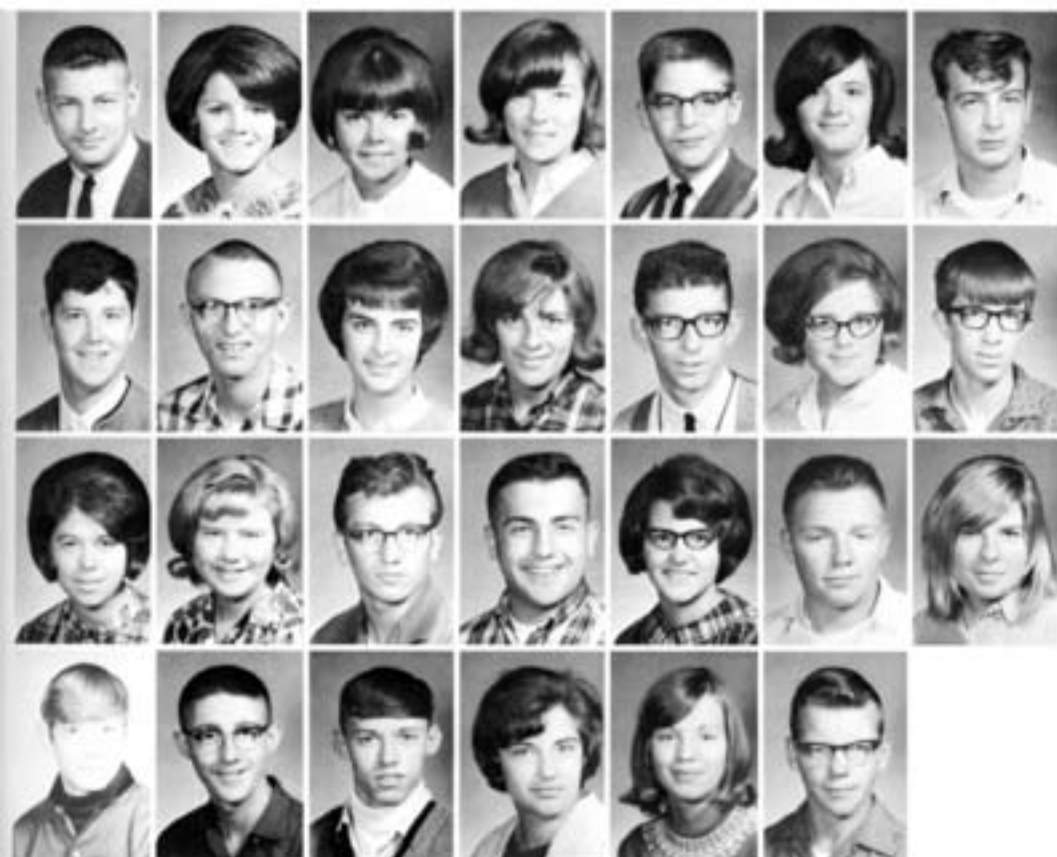

Promoting Health and Sports

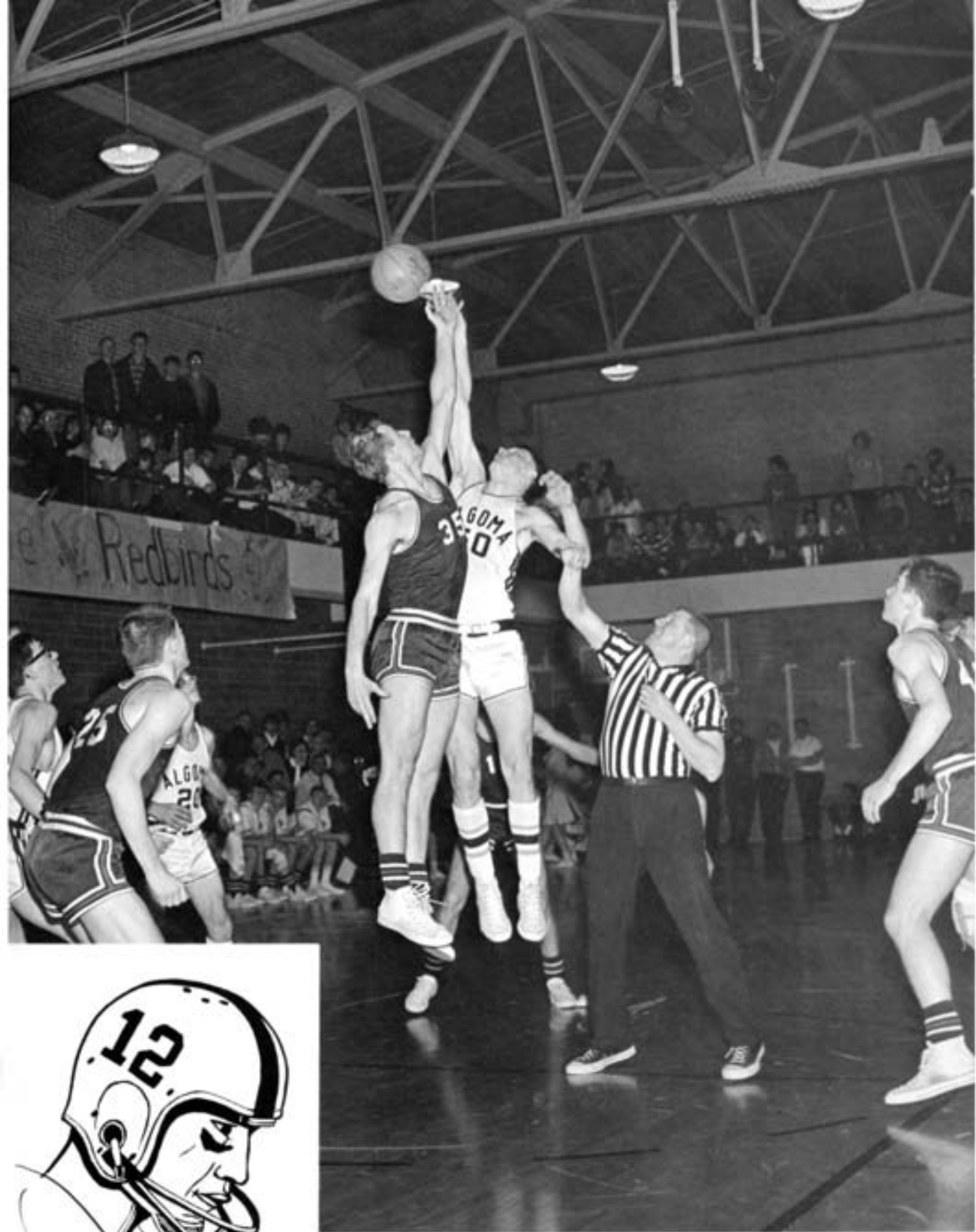

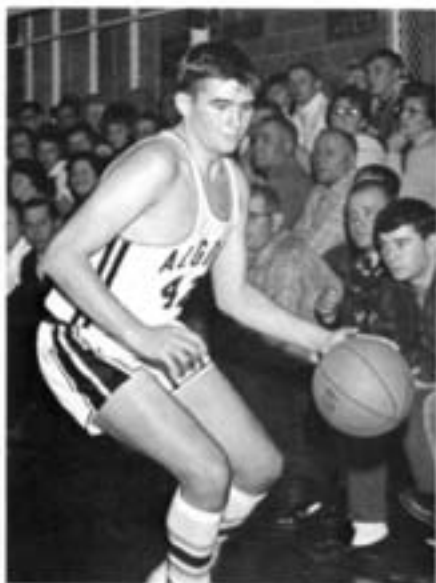

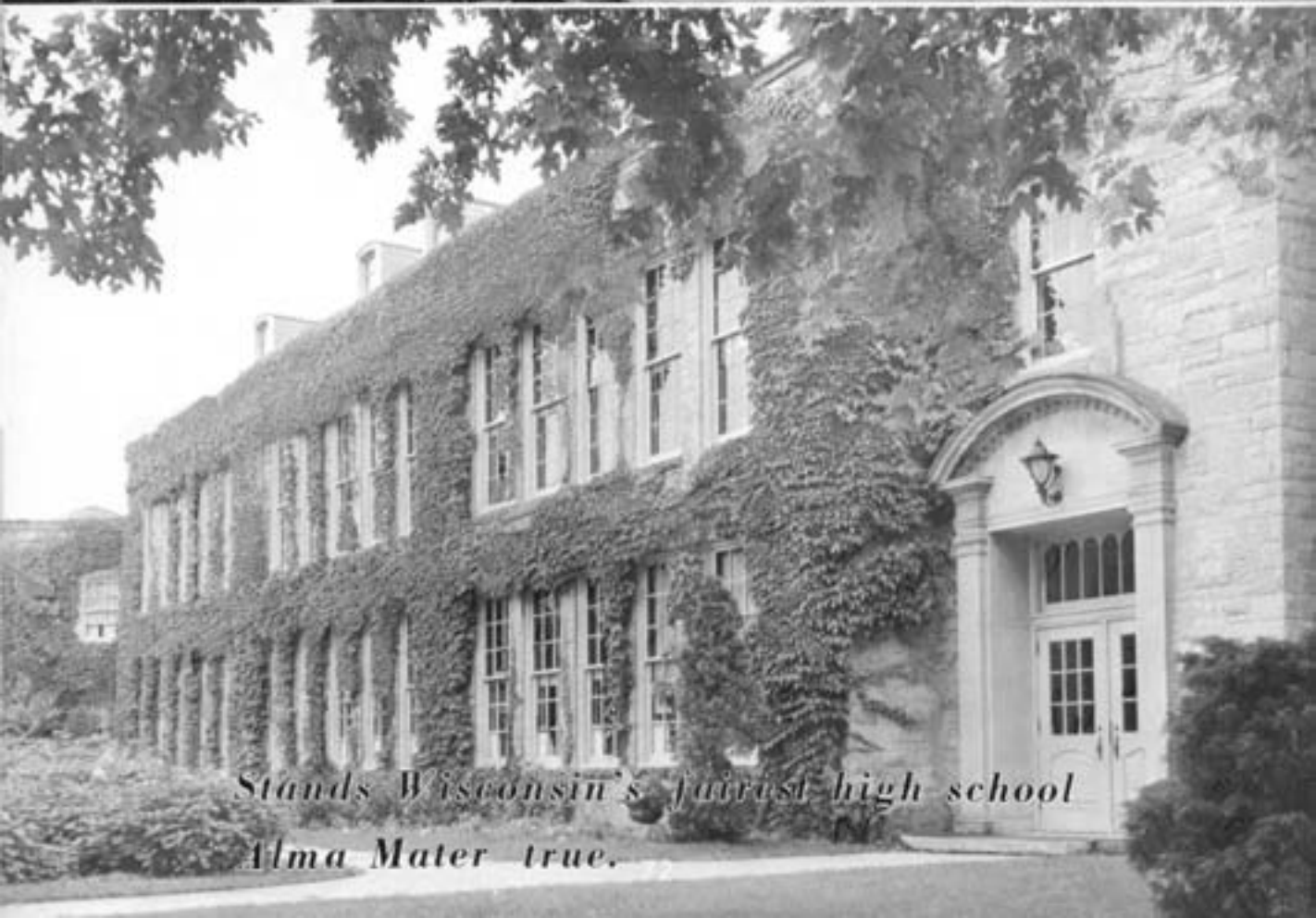
