One of the exciting events included was Thursday night's parade, followed by the bonfire which set the mood for the game to be played against the Chilton Tigers the following night.

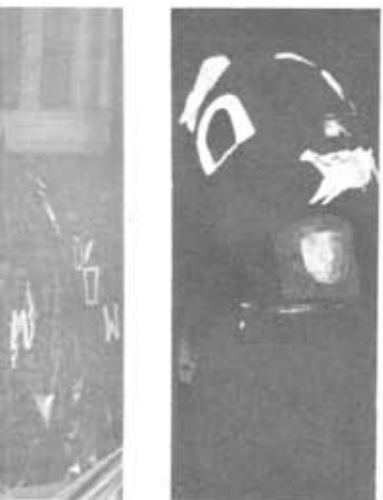

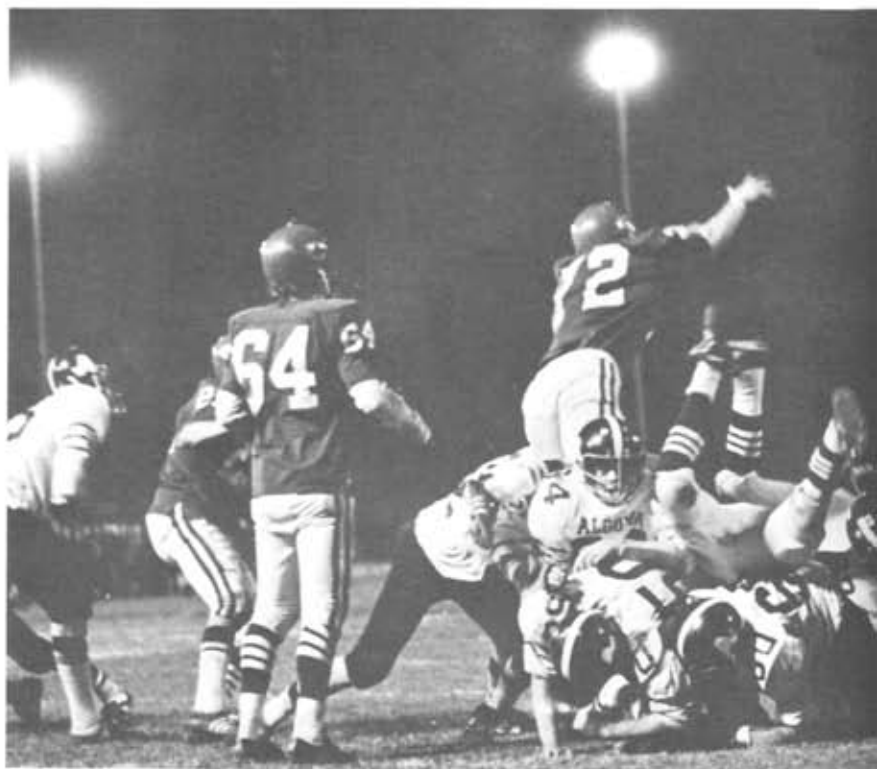
The honor of King and Queen was bestowed on the Senior

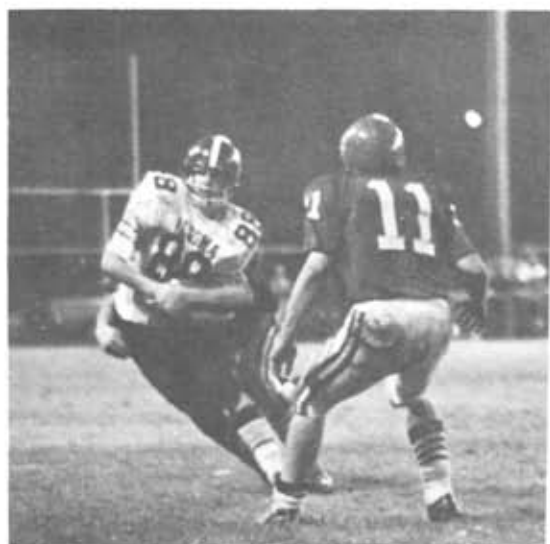
quarterback, Mick Schwedler and his homecoming date, Bonnie Cmejla. Seven other couples represented the Senior class.
