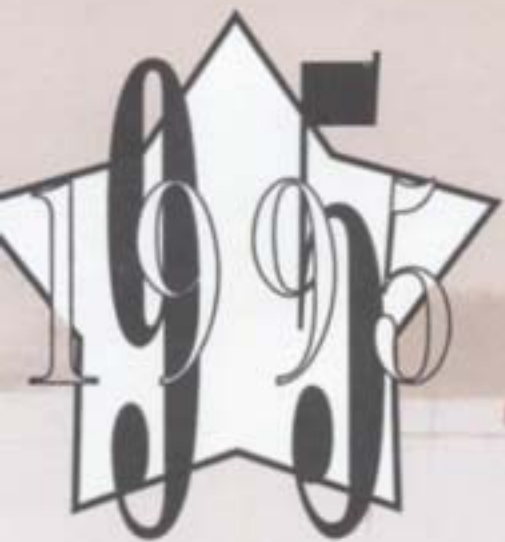

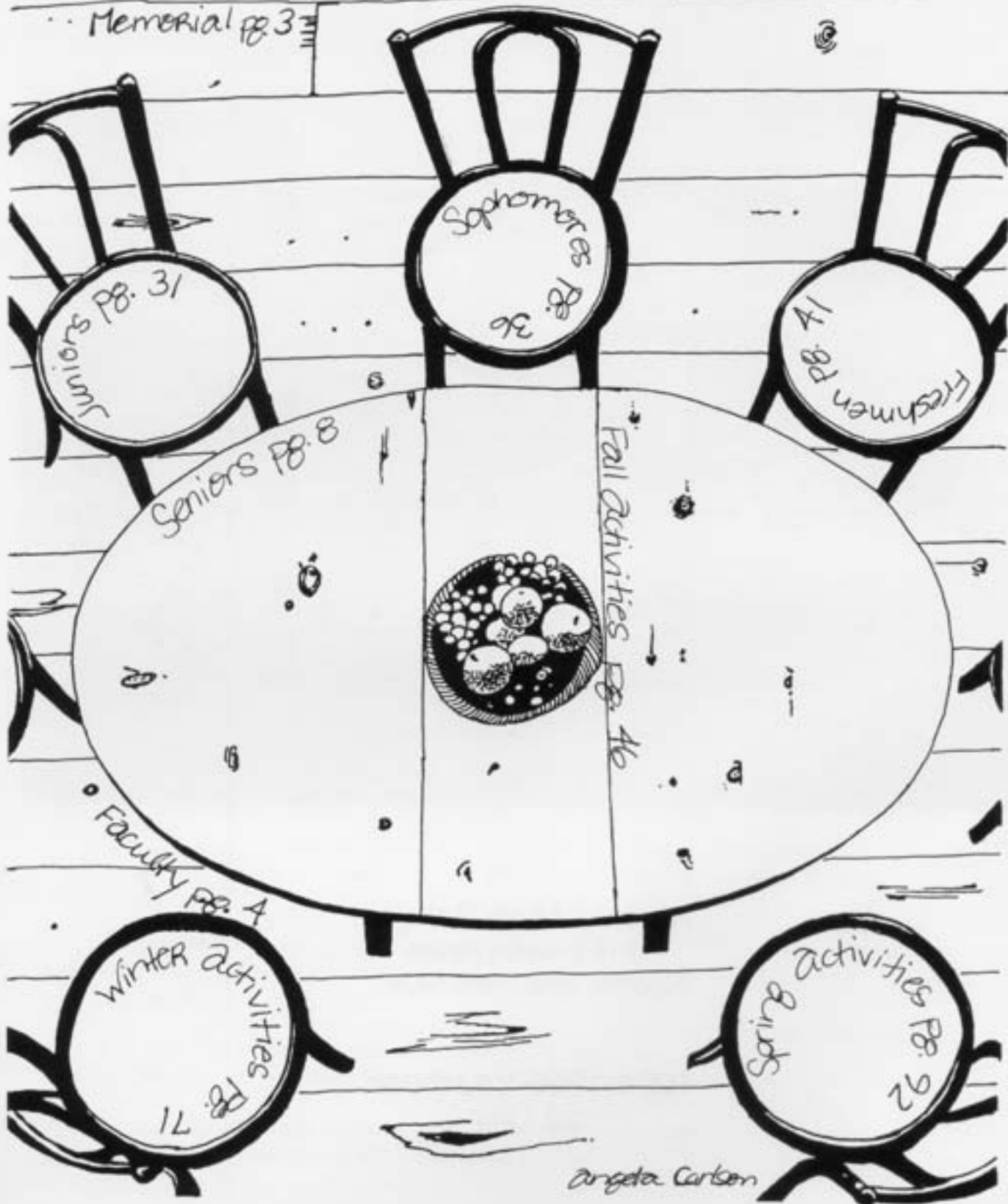

In Memoriam



Harold D. Gehrke, Superintendent
1979 - 1993
School District of Algoma

Mr. Gehrke was a native of Reedsburg, Wisconsin. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in secondary education from the Wisconsin State Teachers College in LaCrosse. He began teaching in 1958 and taught in Mauston and Reedsburg. In 1964, he earned his Masters Degree in Educational Administration from the University of Wisconsin - Madison. Before coming to Algoma, Mr. Gehrke was superintendent in White Lake, Wisconsin. Upon his retirement, Mr. Gehrke had completed 33 years in education: 28 years in administration - 23 of them as superintendent, the last 14 of which were spent in Algoma.

Mr. Gehrke enjoyed the challenge of being a superintendent. His honesty and straightforwardness helped establish good working relationships with both his fellow workers and the community as a whole.

During his 14 years at Algoma, Mr. Gehrke touched the lives of many people - from students, to coworkers, to members of the community. He will not be forgotten.

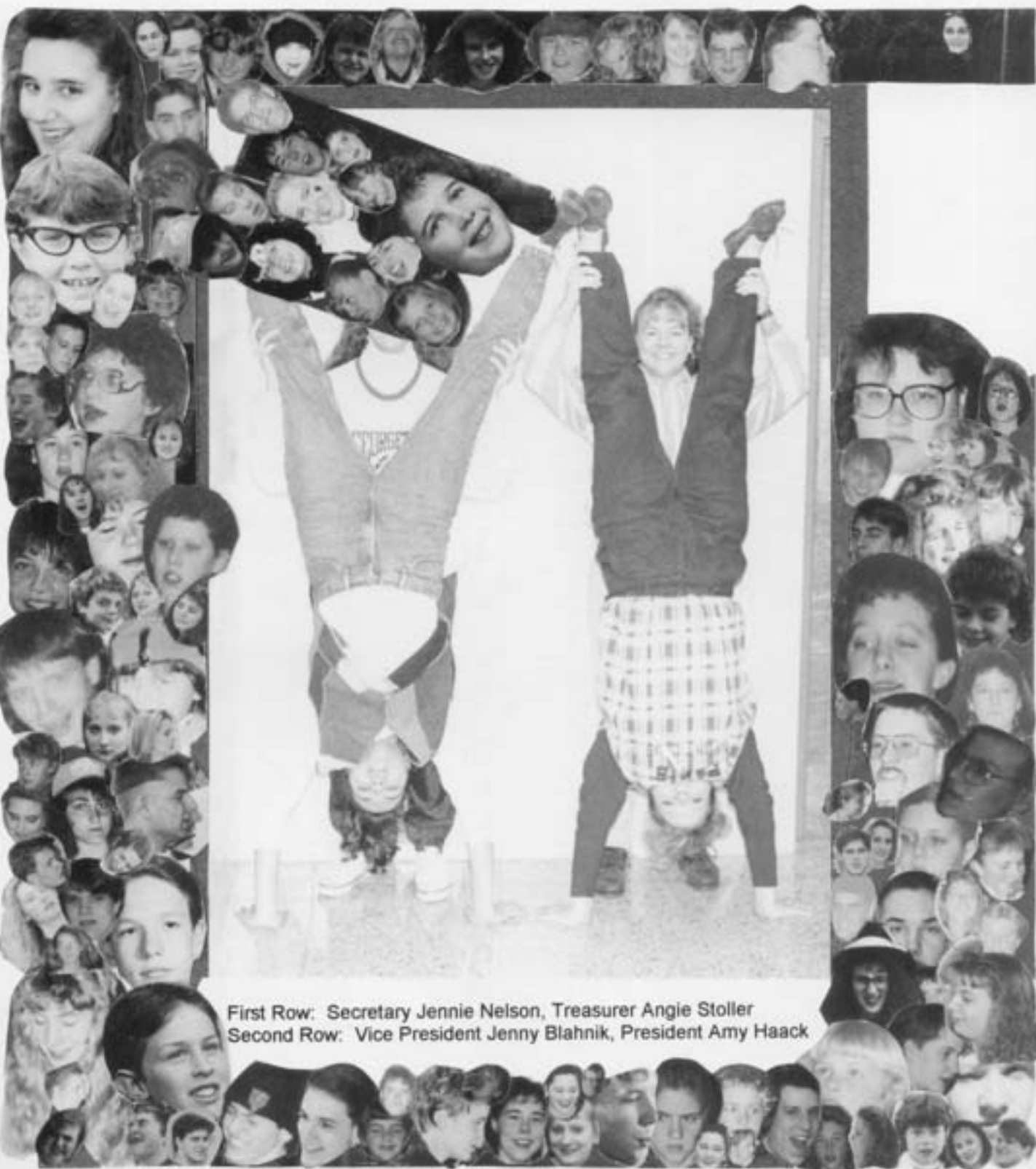

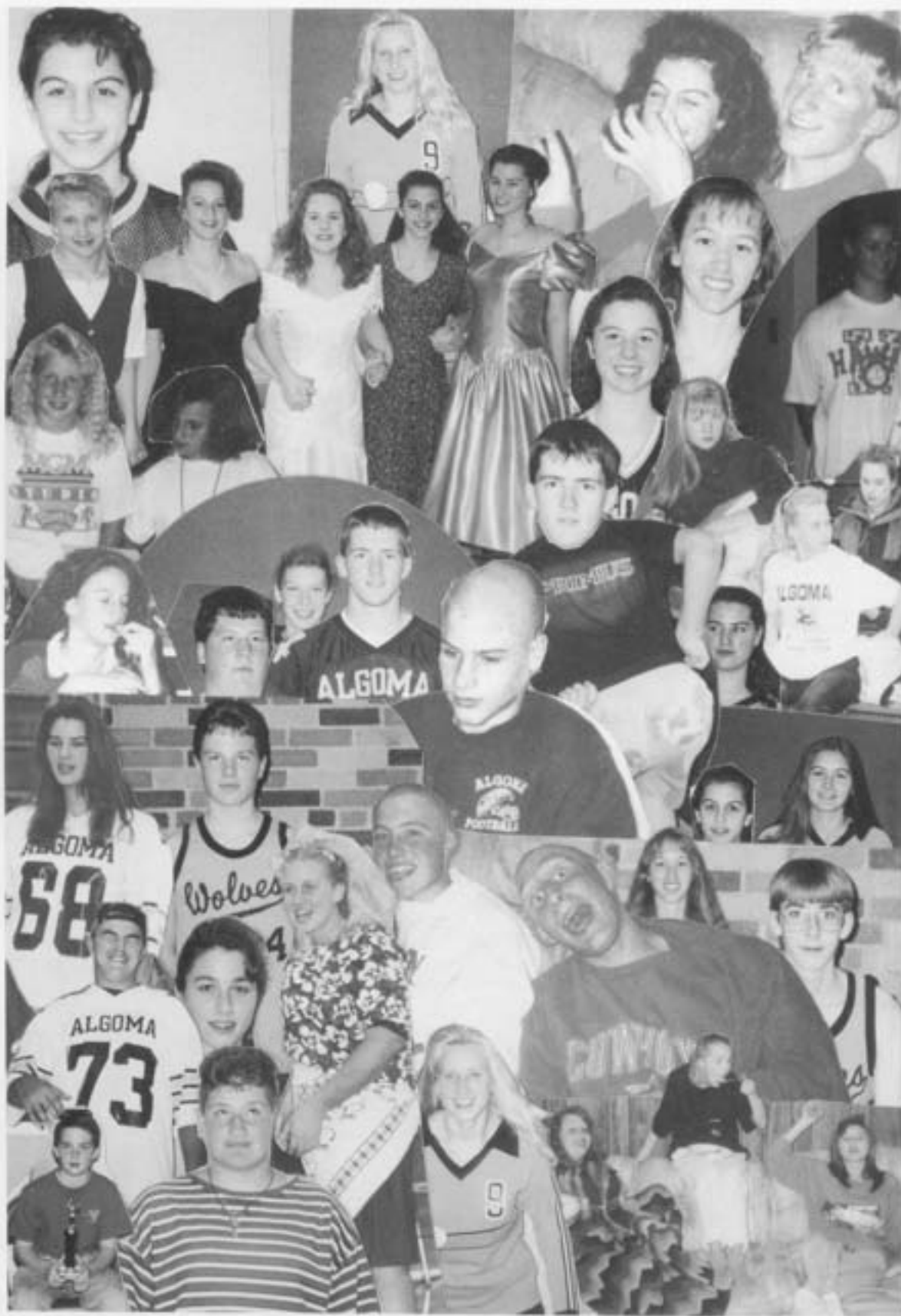

Peer Helpers are a group of concerned students who take the risk of helping their peers with problems. Peer Helpers are trained active listeners. Statistics indicate that when students have a problem, they share that problem with peers long before they share it with adults. Peer Helpers are the first line of defense in helping students get help. In fact, students have probably talked with peer helper and didn't even know it.

In order to become effective helpers, our students have gone through several training sessions such as Teen Institute, Anger & Conflict Management, Death & Grief Support Group, Suicide Prevention Training and general Peer Helper Training. These trainings enable students to learn skills in communication, decision making, affective learning, facilitative listening, and referral and resource management. Peer Helpers also promote affective education by sharing their knowledge and helping skills with elementary school children.

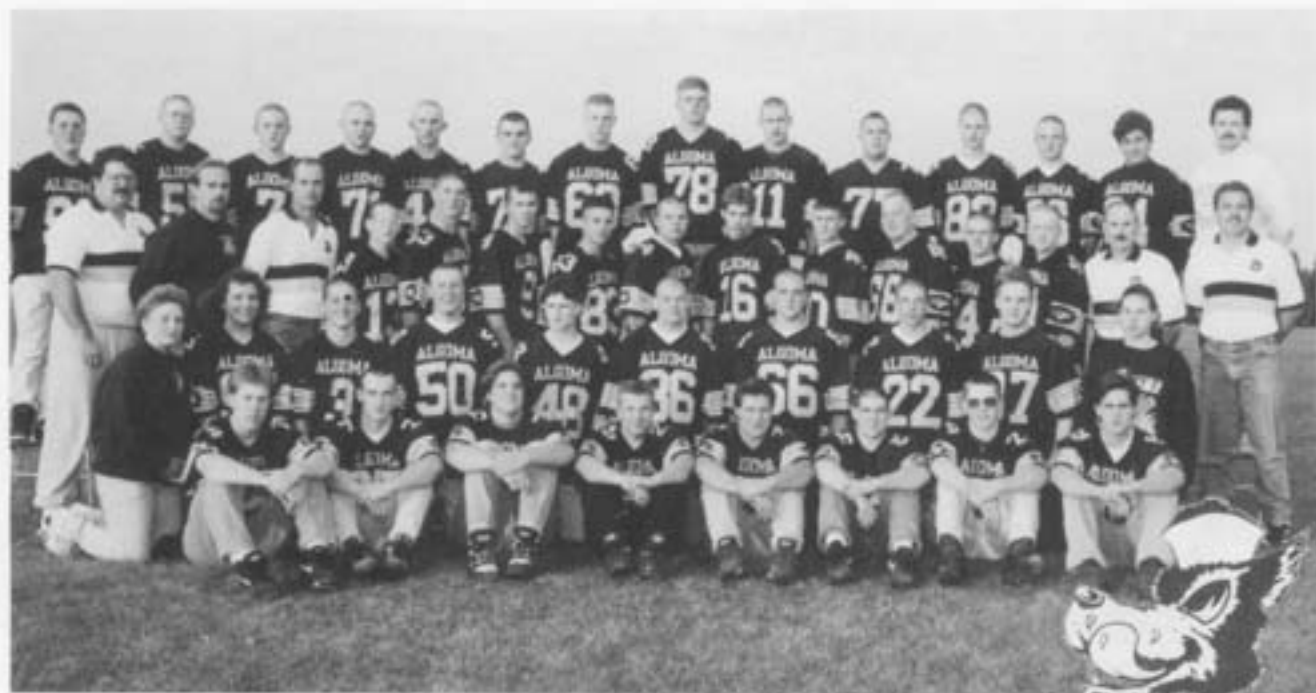

The 1994 football season started out as a puzzle and finished one part short of a masterpiece. Returning only three starters on offense and four on defense, August practice was spent trying to fit various pieces of the puzzle together. Struggling through the rain-shortened scrimmage without gaining a first down, the Wolves wondered what the season would hold for them.

The season opener found Algoma facing not only a spirited Manitowoc Lutheran team but heat and humidity which finally wilted the Wolves in the fourth quarter as they dropped a 24-21 decision. Hosting the Denmark Vikings in the home opener at Perry Field, the Black and Gold, behind some excellent line blocking and 264 yds. rushing by Matt Carmody, broke the close game open in the second quarter and stopped the preseason Olympian leaders 27-13.

Conference play opened with arch rival and conference favorite Kewaunee invading the Wolves den. In a close game finally decided in the last minute to cap a long drive, Algoma defeated the Indians 12-7 and set sail for the Sturgeon Bay Clippers. Traveling north, Algoma found themselves in a physical game with a young, big and tough Sturgeon Bay team. A key 37 yd TD pass from Cmeyla to Schmidt gave the team a lift enroute to a 30-16 win. Returning home, the Wolves spotted the Luz-Casco Spartans a 10 point lead before shifting into gear. Algoma finally established control and won 39-23 Homecoming '94 had the Wolves hosting the scrappy Sevastopol team. Algoma was sluggish but once again dominated the line and emerged with a 28-8 victory.

Algoma was entering the final part of the conference season as they traveled to Oconto to take on the erratic Blue Devils. Scoring on the 3rd play from scrimmage, the Wolves never looked back as they rolled up 500+ yards in total offense and cruised to a 32-6 victory. The Eagles of Southern Door came to Perry Field for Parents' Night and the final home game of the season. A victory would bring a piece of the conference championship as well as a play-off berth. Wasting no time, the Wolves struck pay dirt on the first play as Cmeyla connected with Schmidt for a 43 yd TD. Algoma dominated every aspect of the game winning 38-0 and holding Southern Door to less than 100 yds of total offense. The sirens of the fire trucks told the town that Algoma had won a conference championship. The final conference game found the Wolves at Oconto Falls in a physical barn burner against a good Panther team. Defense took the night off as both teams moved the ball up and down the field. The Wolves hung on to win 34-26 completing an undefeated conference season for the first time.

Entering the playoffs in Division 5, Algoma was matched up with a hard hitting Crivitz team at Bay Port. But lightning struck early as Cmeyla found Carmody on the first play from scrimmage for a 65 yd TD strike. Carmody had an impressive night scoring 5 TD's enroute to a 39-6 victory over the M-O conference runner up. Returning to Bay Port for the second game, the Wolves of Algoma were pitted against the Wolves of Marawa. Struggling in the first half, Algoma was behind 6-7, despite

dominating the line 235 yds to 39 yds. Pulling themselves together at half, the Black and Gold went on to win in the second half 29-7.

The semi-final game was to be played at Beaver Dam against the Cardinals of Darlington. The winner would advance to Madison. Darlington had been there before, many times, and their experience proved to be too much for the Wolves to handle. Algoma played hard and well but could not establish a consistency to their offense nor could they effectively stop the Wing-T offense. It was Darlington's day as they defeated the Wolves 21-0.

New team and individual records were established during the season. Matt Carmody rewrote the individual rushing and scoring records rushing for 2002 yds and scoring 30 TD's 202 pts. the team selected Chad Dequaine and Jason DeJardine as the best blockers, Matt Carmody as the best tackler, Andy Mueller as the Captain and Matt Carmody as the MVP. Individual honors also went to Chad Dequaine-1st team all conference offense and defense; Jason DeJardine-1st team defense and 2nd team offense; Peter Schmidt-1st team offense and defense; Andy Mueller-2nd team defense; Cory Cmeyla-2nd team offense; and Matt Carmody-1st team offense and defense and conference player of the year. Chad and Matt were also selected to the All Region team; Matt made honorable mention All-State and was selected as the Green Bay Press Gazette Player of the Year.

It is amazing what this team accomplished when they all worked together!
