VARSITY FOOTBALL



The Algoma Wolves football team participated in their first season in 1899; 2013 is the first time the Wolves have had an undefeated regular season.

This accomplishment has been marked by their current playoff standing as well as the Green Bay Packers naming head coach Wade Vandervest, "High School Coach of the Week".

Vandervest, who has been coaching the football team for 14 years, and 12 as the head coach, is now preparing his team to go into the second round of Division 6 playoffs this weekend against Iola-Scandinavia.

"Iola has a good athletic team. They are a lot like us," Vandervest said. "It will be one of those games where whoever takes advantage will win."

Vandervest commented that his team is excited to reach this point in the season, but he wants to keep them focused on what they have to do in this game.

"They accomplished something no team has done in school history," Vandervest said. "We need to take this one step at a time."

The 2013 team has broken a few other school records this year, including Sam Koss breaking the single-game rushing record in the second game of the season with 388 yards, which had been held by Ty Kirchman since 1978. Hunter Prokash broke the longest kick return for a touchdown record at 97 yards, previously held by Jordan Parkos since 2003.
